

## Aim of this conference

This 2nd EMA conference aims to provide a platform for discussion, networking and collaboration between countries and midwifery organisations and address the implications of freedom of movement for midwifery education and practice in Europe.

Over the two days of conference, delegates will hear presentations from expert speakers on the current standards of midwifery education and practice in a range of European countries.

During the conference delegates will have the opportunity to

- examine the standards of midwifery practice
- debate the significance of the Bologna process for midwifery education
- have an opportunity to establish Tuning projects between the countries
- examine current processes for free movement of midwives within the EU
- discuss opportunities for developing shared learning between countries
- learn about new aspects of midwifery programmes

## Background

The first EMA education conference, in Stockholm in 2004, created an invaluable arena for midwives and midwife educators to discuss midwifery education in Europe.

Three years later there is still a need of improvement in midwifery education programmes in many countries. New and rapidly changing challenges in the health care sector demand that the education of midwives is continuously reviewed. With the enlargement of the EU it is important to understand the various levels and standards of midwifery education within the EU. With free movement of midwives within the EU it is vital to provide an opportunity for discussion, networking and collaboration between different organisations and countries.


